

Ukrainian refugees in South Tyneside – update from Churches Together South Tyneside. In 1979 Churches Together established STARCH to enable local churches and the wider community to assist asylum seekers. Initially 12 families of Vietnamese Boat People arrived. Since then asylum seekers from around the world, most recently Syria and Afghanistan. Margaret Gregg (trustee of STARCH) and Jo Benham Brown (Key 2 Life) are members of the South Tyneside Council working party for asylum seekers/refugees, and STARCH has been appointed to lead the local response to Ukraine. Anyone wishing to offer accommodation to Ukrainian refugees should register now at 'Homes for Ukraine' on the government website. The Council are appointing support officers who will facilitate medical, school admittance etc. Donations of clothes, nappies, toiletries are not yet needed, nor financial donations, which it is recommended are sent via the Disasters Emergency Committee Ukraine Appeal (Christian Aid, CAFOD and Tearfund are members). When refugees arrive, STARCH will be asking for volunteers to welcome them and befriend them. Contact Margaret Gregg (07914123259) or Jo Benham Brown (07841143482) f or further details.

Please note all national and local organisations are working together and supporting each others efforts on an ongoing basis to support all refugees and asylum seekers.
